- Understand the challenges faced by Southern scholars while researching and publishing on disability-inclusive education.
- Increase the Southern scholarship visibility and collaboration

Research Exchange Participant Profile

- Workshops held in June, July and September 2021
- 63% of participants had collaborated on internationally funded research
- 33% of participants identified as a person with a disability






Research Evidence


- What challenges are faced by the Southern scholarship in conducting robust research on disability-inclusive education?
